Development Services Director Chuck Harrington gave a brief overview of the item noting the applicant desires to start an in-home childcare. The current zoning allows for this use through a special use permit approved by the City Council. Planning & Zoning heard the item and had a list of five items that were concerns. Subsequently, the applicant submitted a revised floor plan that meets the conditions. They have also provided a letter of support from the Saddle Club HOA. As of March 20 they had received 2 letters of objection but since that time have received an additional 12 letters which will require super majority approval.

Mayor Morales opened the public hearing at 10:30 a.m.

Arthur Rybicki, 5001 Heather Rd, reported he was opposed to changing the zoning expressing concern that approval of this item could open them up for other commercial uses. He thought this business would have a negative impact on his neighborhood, would increase traffic, and increase liability risk to the homeowners association. He did not want anything in his neighborhood that would diminish the quite peaceful life and charm of his community. Council Member Love clarified that this is not a request to change the zoning but was for a zoning use only.

Brett Muenlbrea, 5011 Castleford Road, expressed concern for his children's safety noting they play in the front yard. The applicant moved in eight months ago and wants to change the neighborhood. This item would affect many people on their block. He recognized the shortage of daycares but felt it would be better situation in a commercial property where it would not affect his property values.

Bill Webb, 5104 Castleford Road, reported he lives 500 feet from property that wishes to have a childcare. He has lived in his house for over 30 years and was opposed to the daycare center because of increased traffic and congestion, devalued properties.

Anne Evans, 4908 Lancashire Rd, has lived in her home for 20 years. She wished her HOA had asked the residents how they felt about a daycare before providing a letter of support. She shared information about Midland zoning noting she thought by what she read it should not be allowed. She encouraged Mrs. Castillo to seek a commercial property for her daycare. Council Member Sparks clarified that a day care is allowed in this zoning with a permit and that other commercial businesses would not be allowed in residential zoning.

Eugene Hodge, 4908 Heather, reported he lives on the street behind the applicant and has been there for 25 years. He is opposed to a childcare facility in the area due to added traffic and congestion.

Jo Sneed, 5012 Castleford, lives across the street from the applicant and has lived there for 25 years. She reported there are many children who live in the area and play in their front yards and the street. She had concern about increased traffic with so many neighborhood children. She noted there are also special needs children in the area. She lives next to a pass through for a pipeline easement and felt it would be used as a shortcut. She felt the daycare may increase trash, traffic and noise and asked Council to vote in opposition.

Tiffany Castillo, 5009 Castleford, reported she plans to open a childcare facility not a center noting a center is outside of a residence. She will be licensed for up to 12 children but plans to have 9 or 10. She has met all of the requirements brought up by the fire marshal and the City Code. She understands and respects her neighbor's opinions and has done her best to ease their fears. Her daughter who is 16 has severe depression and is at home. Ms. Castillo taught children with special needs for 12 years and this is a business she could run at home to be with her daughter. She has put a lot of work into this and asked Council to approve her request. A picture was shown of her driveway and she shared that drop off and pick up would be in the driveway.

Council Member Hotchkiss reported she first heard this item at Planning & Zoning noting the neighbors asked that she have fewer children but heard that Ms. Castillo can only make this work with 9 or 10 children. She emphasized that she thought the neighborhood would support this if it were less children.

Council Member Sparks noted that it would be around 14 trips a days for drop off and pick up and that a teenager would bring in more traffic than that. He asked those opposed if they had changed their mind after hearing information from staff. The opposition expressed their minds had not been changed.

There being no one else present wishing to speak, the public hearing closed at 10:56 a.m.
