



New and existing Electrical Power Permits

Definitions:

1. **Early Release Electrical power-** This is the term refers to the first permanent power establish on the property. This does not include site that have already had power but are building a brand-new service.
2. **Power Release-** This term refers to permanent power that is already established on a property. This can only be released if the power has been off for less than 6 months.
3. **Temporary Power Pole-** This term is used for a meter on power pole that is for used for a temporary set time.
4. **Service Change-** This term is used for all properties that have existing permanent power and will be upgrading, moving, and repairing.
5. **Electrical Reconnect-** This term refers to permanent power on a property that has not been upgraded, moved, or repaired, but has been off for more than 6 months.

Electrical Power permits:

1. **Early Release Electrical permit (\$50)-** This permit is for brand new services for a property that have never existed before. This permit is required for any New Commercial and Residential projects. This permit can also be applied to new services for utilities, water well systems, irrigation systems, small cell, and large cell towers. The property owner, general contractor, or electrical contractor can pull this permit, under a building permit
2. **Power Release Permit (\$0)-** This is a no charge permit for properties who are trying to release their power and there is no change of occupancy and the power has been off for less than 6-month period. Must fill out Application to connect utilities.
3. **Temporary Power Pole (\$50)-** This permit is for temporary power on a temp pole. This does not pertain to temporary power for an existing meter.

T-pole permits cannot be issued unless there is a building permit in the system or have been given express permission from the Building Official.

4. **Service Change (\$50)**- This permit will consist of upgrading, moving, or repairing an existing service. This permit requires an Electrical Contractor.
5. **Electrical Reconnect (\$50)**- This permit does not consist of upgrading, moving, or repairing the existing service; however, the power has been off for longer than 6 months and requires an inspection before releasing the power.
